Men Born, Resident or Associated with Matlock Bath who are known to have served in The Great War

Anyone attempting to compile a Great War Roll of Honour, whether during the War itself or retrospectively, faces the difficult task of identifying all those who should be considered for inclusion in the list and then making decisions as to those who should qualify and those who should be omitted. There are obvious names such as the men who were born and lived in the community, but what of those who had moved away but whose parents still dwelt in the community, or those who worked in the area but who resided outside the parish boundary? It is particularly difficult for a community like Matlock Bath where lives overlapped so much with the neighbouring communities of Cromford, Scarthin, Matlock, Starkholmes and even Bonsall and Wirksworth.

The following attempt tends to be inclusive, but the varied sources and the passage of time makes it unlikely to be entirely accurate or complete (for example the Absent Voters List would not include servicemen who were not old enough to vote.)

The information can only be as good as the available sources and for any omissions or inadvertent inaccuracies the author apologises, but it was felt it was better to compile a long overdue Roll of Honour “warts and all” rather than avoid the challenge altogether.

The names shown in **Bold Type** are those who died. Those shown in **Underlined Bold Type** are those commemorated on the Matlock Bath Memorial.

The reason for their inclusion is given in the second column as follows:

: *A = Association with Matlock Bath Bn = Born in Matlock Bath*
Bp = Baptised in Matlock Bath R = Resident FR = Former Resident

Only one claim, the strongest, is shown against each individual's name.

D of W = Died of Wounds NKG = No Known Grave
F & F = France and Flanders SD = Soldiers Died
